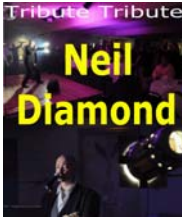

Day 1 We are traveling north to Pioneer Valley, MA. Our first visit is the Wistariahurst Museum in Holyoke. This National Historic Landmark, originally the home of prominent silk manufacturer, William Skinner and his family, has stood as an example of elegance and fine architecture since 1874. Then we are off to visit the Calvin Coolidge presidential

Library & Museum. The museum contains materials documenting the private life of Calvin Coolidge (1872-1933), beginning with his birth and formative years in Vermont, his student days at Amherst College, and his years as a young lawyer in Northampton. Afterwards we will check into the Hotel Northampton in Northampton, MA. Dinner is included. **D**

Day 2 After breakfast we will stop at Historic Northampton, a museum of local history in the heart of the Connecticut River Valley of western MA. The museum maintains an exhibit chronicling the rich history of Northampton in its main gallery. We will then visit the Joseph Allen Skinner Museum, a 20th-century cabinet of curiosities. The Museum consists of the diverse collections of Joseph Skinner (1867-1946), a local manufacturer and philanthropist. The Museum's collections include early American furniture and decorative arts, a 19th-century "gentleman's" library, lighting devices, arms and armor, American Indian material culture, minerals and fossils, and travel souvenirs from China, Egypt, and many other locales. **B**

After lunch we will visit the Franconia Heritage Museum located in an 1880 New England Farm House with attached barn and sheds. Our last attraction of the day will be the Frost Place, the famous poet's farm homestead. Since 1977 a contemporary poet has been awarded a residency each summer. Some of Frost's most enduring poems were written here from 1915 to 1920. The Frost Place is a "house museum", a sanctuary for lovers of poetry and books on a quiet North Country lane with a spectacular view of the White Mountains. **B, D**

Day 3 Our last day will be a cruise on Squam Lake and we will experience the beauty of Squam Lake and learn about the natural history of lakes, the wildlife that makes these lakes so special, and the people who have enjoyed these lakes for over 5,000 years. We will have free time on our own to visit the Kirkwood Gardens featuring colorful plants in full bloom. This informal garden is full of life, naturally attracting birds and butterflies. **B**

Horace Trumbauer to design a house modeled after the mid-18th century French chateau d'Asnieres (c.1750) outside Paris. Our next stop is the Newport Flower Show at the Rosecliff. The theme is Salsa. Enjoy the heat of Salsa - exotic plants and colorful designs, inspired by the fusion of Latin Music and dance. Rosecliff was modeled after the Grand Trianon at Versailles. This beautiful house was completed in 1902 for Nevada silver heiress Tessie Oelrichs, one of Newport's leading society hostesses. **B**
